




Software Industry Growing Up







In the early days

- MySQL was created with the intention to make money from the very beginning but keeping the Free Software spirit in mind.
- 1995: MySQL Free Public License
 - Did not apply to MySQL on MS Windows
 - Free to use, distribute and modify as long as no money changes hands
- Commercial Licenses for selling MySQL as part of a product
- Basic support via email
- Extended support covered login and phone support
- Widespread adoption due to liberal licensing terms
